

**REGULAR MEETING
MINOCQUA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
June 2nd, 2026**

A regular meeting of the Minocqua Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Mark Hartzheim at 5:00 p.m. on June 2nd, 2026 in the Board Room of the Minocqua Center.

Present were: Chairman Mark Hartzheim; Supervisors, Billy Fried, Brian Fricke. Lance Krolczyk and Erika Petersen; Roben Haggart, Town Clerk; Mark Pertile, Director of Public Works; Glenn Janzer, Chief of Police and Rich Carani, Fire Chief.

Motion by Fricke, seconded by Petersen to approve the agenda as presented. Voice Vote: Motion Carried.

Motion by Fricke, seconded by Fried to approve the minutes from the Regular Town Board meeting held on May 19th, 2026. Voice Vote: Motion Carried.

OLD BUSINESS

HIGHWAY 70 WEST MULTI-USE PATH

Mark Pertile reviewed each option for developing the trail on the north side versus the south side of Highway 70 West. If the trail is on the north side there would be crossings at Morgan Road and Camp Pinemere Road to access to the park. The board had concerns about speed limit on Highway 70 West. Mark Pertile will request a Department of Transportation (DOT) study once the trail is developed. The town needs to choose which side the ped/bike path should be developed in order to keep the grant application moving forward. The north side would be less cost to the town. Annual maintenance of the trail would be approximately \$10,000, which the town would be responsible for. The ATV club did a study and provided copies to the board for review. Both the ATV club and snowmobile club would like the ped/bike path on the south side, leaving the north side for the ATV-UTV/Snowmobile trail. Judy Domaczak addressed the board with her reasons for wanting the bike/ped trail on the northside. She feels having the ATV-UTV's on the northside would disrupt her zoo business and create a potential conflict with vehicles entering her business. Supervisor Fricke stated that he is against developing the trail as there are other priorities for the town. Chairman Hartzheim would like to see the bike/ped trail on the southside as it would be a continuation of the Bearskin Trail and eliminate the crossings on Highway 70.

Motion by Fried, seconded by Petersen to develop the bike/ped path on the north side of Highway 70 West and the ATV/UTV and snowmobile trail on the south side. Voice Vote: Motion carried 3 to 2. Chairman Hartzheim and Supervisor Fricke voted nay.

SECOND READING & ADOPTION – CAMPING IN TOWN PARKING SPACES PROHIBITED

Chairman Hartzheim presented Ordinance Amendment Sec. 41-64-After-hours park activity; and Sec. 56-223-Camping in town parking spaces prohibited for a second reading and adoption.

Motion by Fried, seconded by Fricke to dispense with the actual reading and adopt amended Ordinance Sec. 56-223 as presented. Voice Vote: Motion Carried.

NEW BUSINESS

ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW PERMIT-

Administrative Review Permit #23-26: James Rein, applicant, Andrew & Madison Alesauskas, owners, to operate a commercial storage rental facility that includes constructing three (3) storage building on the following described property: Lots 1 & 2, CSM 4561, Section 34, T39N, R6E, MI-2493-5 & MI 2493-6. (9796 Lee Road next to & behind the BP south gas station). Andrew Alesauska was present and answered questions from the board.

Motion by Fried, seconded by Fricke to approve Administrative Review Permit#23-26 as presented contingent upon all County requirements being met. Voice Vote: Motion Carried.

FOOD TRUCK POLICY MODIFICATIONS

Chairman Hartzheim presented a list of food truck items to be discuss.

Parking Lot E- Allow food truck location in the parking spots adjacent to the Highway.

Overnight parking- Allow overnight parking for consecutive days.

Number of food trucks per week- Modify to allow the same food truck up to 3 times at one location per week. Can set-up at other locations both on & off the Island.

Background check requirement- The Clerk will work with the police chief on background checks and will bring any concerns to the board before approval.

Penalty for not obtaining a permit- Establish a penalty of three times the fee (\$150) and prohibit food trucks for 6 months for a business hosting a food truck without permit

FOOD TRUCK APPLICATION – YAHOO BARBECUE

Clerk Roben Haggart presented a food truck application for Yahoo Barbecue, Charles Kandutsch, owner for various dates at The Bottled Bean. & Northern Waters Distillery for approval.

Motion by Fricke, seconded by Fried to approve as presented. Voice Vote: Motion Carried.

FOOD TRUCK APPLICATION – SAUCY NOODS

Clerk Roben Haggart presented a food truck application for Saucy Noods, Tanner Kratochvil, owner for various dates at The Bottled Bean for approval.

Motion by Fricke, seconded by Fried to approve as presented. Voice Vote: Motion Carried.

FOOD TRUCK APPLICATION – WAKE & LAKE

Clerk Roben Haggart presented a food truck application for Wake & Lake, Traci Petrie, owner on Parking Lot E, TJ's Butcher Block & Stoney Creek throughout the summer for approval.

Motion by Fricke, seconded by Krolczyk to approve as presented. Voice Vote: Motion Carried. Supervisor Petersen abstained.

2026-2027 LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATIONS

Clerk Roben Haggart presented the 2026-2027 liquor license renewals for approval.

Motion by Fried, seconded by Petersen to approve as presented. Voice Vote: Motion Carried.

TEMPORARY BEER LICENSE – MINOCQUA MUSEUM

Clerk Roben Haggart presented a Temporary Alcohol Beverage License application from the Minocqua Museum on June 19th & 20th for the Minocqua Antique & Classic Boat Show at Torpy Park for approval.
